As Chairperson of the Tapuika Iwi Authority and on behalf of the Board of Trustees, it is a privilege to present to you this Annual Report on our governance activities over the 12 months.

Acknowledgement

I would like to take this opportunity to acknowledge our koroua, papa, Uncle Nuia Kokiri who passed away during the year. As a Trustee on the Board he served with quiet dignity, providing a voice of reason during intense negotiations with the Crown and overlapping claimants. His commitment to iwi and hapu development was evident in his consistency and loyalty to the kaupapa, attending every Hui until his physical health prevented further involvement.

Iwi Register

As at 30 June 2017, the number of Tapuika individuals on the Iwi Register was 2,607.

Trustee Elections

Trustee elections were held during the year for 4 (four) hapu Trustees to represent each of the hapu of Tapuika, in addition and additional Ngati Kuri hapu Trustee was elected to serve out the remaining term of the late Nuia Kokiri.

The hapu Trustees elected for a term of three years are:

- Dean Flavell Ngati Tuheke
- Dr Bryce Kihirini Ngati Moko
- Melanie Biel Ngati Marukukere
- Heketua Roberts Ngati Kuri
- Rawiri Biel Ngati Kuri (for a term of 12 months)

Iwi Social Development

Key results:

- Approved grants for maintenance and upkeep of 5 Tapuika marae
- 24 tertiary education grants approved with one recipient undertaking Masters
- Tapuika reo pilot for members with little or no reo both in th home and workplace
- Joint Venture Waikato University to monitor water quality in the Kaituna River
- Ongoing involvement in Kaituna Catchment resource consents and water allocation applications
- Ongoing representation on Te Maru o Kaituna, WBOPDC Te Arawa Takutai Moana Forum, BOPDHB Runanga, TCC Tangata Whenua Forum

Financial Performance

During the year, the priority for the Trustees has been to improve the financial position of the Iwi Authority by reducing expenditure and increasing revenue.

Based on the previous year's Audited Statement of Financial Performance (2016) a decision was made by the Trustees to reduce operational costs in the following key areas in order to prevent further erosion of the lwi capital.

However to maintain continuity of operations during the Reporting Period (2017), the Trustees agreed that the expected reduction in costs would be implemented over a 2 year period.

Key Results (30 June 2017):

- Rental costs reduced from \$346,639 to \$119,337. A reduction in costs of \$227,302 or 35%
- Revenue from rentals increased by 8%
- Investment in Kawerau Dairies confirmed
- Helen Nathan (East Brewster) appointed to lead Employee restructure with key results to show in the 2018
 Audited Financial Statements

Key Issues:

- Infrastructure costs
- Administration costs increased due to:
 - Lengthy period in renegotiating commercial leases (formerly leased by the Crown at peppercorn rates) to reflect market rates
 - Difficulty in gaining easements to land locked blocks marked for development with identified joint partners
 - participation in Tribunal water claim
 - valuations to determine increase in rental/lease
- Delays in release of revenue from forestry harvest has meant that approximately one million dollars is being held by MPI in an account for which the Iwi Authority has a 55% stake

Over the next 12 months the Trustees and I expect to see an active development program in place to maximise Iwi assets while maintaining strategies to continue reducing expenditure in order to achieve an improved financial position and capital base.



Tapuika Iwi Authority Trust

The purpose of which the Tapuike Iwi Authority (TIA) is to receive, manage and administer the Trust Funds on behalf of and for the benefit of the present and future members of Tapuika including without limitation:

- To affirm Tapuika tino rangatiratanga, manawhenua, mana moana.
- Preserve, relieve and protect ngā tikanga, me ngā taonga o Tapuika
- The promotion amongst Tapuika of the educational, spiritual, economic, social and cultural advancement and the health and wellbeing of Tapuika.
- The maintenance and establishment of places of cultural or spiritual significance to Tapuika.
- Any other purposes that is considered by the Trust from time to time to be benficial to Tapuika.

Governance of the TIA is made up of eleven elected Tapuika members comprising of of two representatives from each of the four hapu residing within te takapu o Tapuika, and three taurahere members representing *Tamaki Makaurau* - *Te Tai Tokerau*, *Te Puku o te Ika*, *Te Waipounamu*. The Chair and Deputy Chair are appointed by the Trustees. The Current Chairperson is Carol Biel and the Deputy Chair is Ateremu McNeill.

Tapuika Iwi Authority Kaunihera Koeke

The Kaunihere Koeke is a sub-committee of the Iwi Authority comprising of Ngā Koeke o Tapuika who provide advice on Tapuika tikangā, kawa, whakapapa and customary practice to the Authority. The Kaunihera Koeke meets with the Trustees of the Iwi Authority at least once a year.

Tapuika Iwi Authority Development Trust

The Development Trust is the social development arm of the Iwi Authoritu. It is a registered Charitable trust with a Board of 5 Trustees appointed by the Iwi Authority for a term of 3 years. The Chairman of the Trust is Raiha Biel and the Deputy Chair is Hone Pini. The Development Trust is involved in the areas of education, health, promoting Tapuika, resource management, housing and employment. The trust reports to the Iwi Authority on a quarterly basis.

Tapuika Management

The role of the management unit is to develop and communicate the overall purpose and structure of the Tapuika Iwi Authority and its subsidiaries to key stakeholders, build an effective staff culture, lead planned activities while providing operational support to the Tapuika Iwi Authority and the entities shown in the above diagram and monitor finances.

Trustee Fees

As per resolution of the Tapuika AGM held 20 Feb 2015, Trustees receive a meeting fee of \$850 per meeting, the Chairperson receives \$1530 per meeting and the Deputy Chairperson receives \$1060 per meeting. Board members are reimburssed for resonable expenses including mileage at a rate of 0.77c per km.

Recommended Board Fees 2017 / 2018

In accordance with the Tapuika Iwi Authority Trust Deed an independent proffessional body is required to make recommendations on Board and Sub Committee Fees each year.

Accountability and Communications

The Board acknowledges its responsibility to maintain open communication with it's members. 3. Annual Audited Financial Report 2016

The Deputy Chair (A.McNeill) presented the Annual Audited Financial Report for the Year Ended 30 June 2016.

The Statement of financial Performance shows the Tapuika Iwi Authority ended the year with \$430k loss. There was much discussion from the floor. M.Wihapi had concerns that the costs related to generating rental income, far outweighed the actual generated rental income. Other people from the floor voiced the same concerns in relation to the high administrative expenses, employee costs and management fees.

The Trustees responded to the concerns expressed informing the meeting the high rental costs was due to the poor condition of the rental homes at settlement and the new requirements of the Residential Tenancy Act. These were one off costs. The meeting was also informed that Tapuika Forestry assets have not been included in the Audit Report with approx \$440,000 in revenue due to Tapuika from harvesting rights. K.Paul offered his services to help cut costs of Administration.

1. Fish for Tangihanga

Concerns expressed that since Tapuika have withdrawn from Te Kotahitanga o Te Arawa Waka Fisheries (TKoTAWF), whanau may not be able to access fish for tangihanga

The TIA Deputy Chair, A.McNeill responded has an assurance from the CEO TKoTAWF that Tapuika whanau will continue to receive Fish for Tangihanga until the transfer is completed.

A suggestion from the floor was that whanau be given a chance to submit ideas for generating revenue and investment.

The TIA Deputy Chair A.McNeill responded stating TIA have a commercial arm (Tapuika Holdings Limited) whose sole purpose is to invest and generate revenue. He suggested if any whanau have any investment ideas, recommendations or business proposals to submit to their Hapu representatives on the TIA board.

3. Use of 'Charitable status', for hapu funding purposes

A question was asked of the Trustees whether the Hapu/Marae can utilize the TIA's 'Charitable Status' for funding purposes?

A.McNeill spoke responded stating will raise with the TIA Development Trust for consideration

4. Organization Restructure

In the light of the Audited Financial Statement of Performance, the TIA Trustees identified a review of the current organization structure and operations as a high priority over the next 12 months. In terms of operations will need to contract an independent specialist with expertise in Employment legislation and Human Resource Management to work in collaboration with the TIA General Manager.
