<p><u>Frances Irwin Hunt Art Scholarship (Undergraduate)</u> Available to full-time Māori undergraduate students studying in the fields of performing or cultural arts which may include, but not be limited to: dance, music, art, theatre/film. Priority will be given to students with academic merit and financial need.</p>	<p>\$3,500 6 recipients</p>
<p><u>Māori Education Trust Bachelor of Applied Social Work Scholarship</u> Criteria: Available to Māori students enrolled in a Bachelor of Applied Social Work at North Tec: Tai Tokerau Wānanga. Applicants must have completed their first year of study. Priority will be given to students with academic merit and financial need.</p>	<p>\$1,500 Per annum for two years 4 recipients</p>
<p><u>Māori Education Trust Bachelor Degree of Medicine And Surgery Scholarship</u> Criteria: Available to Māori undergraduate students who have completed Part II of a Bachelor of Medicine and Surgery degree. Priority will be given to students with academic merit and financial need.</p>	<p>\$2,500 Per annum for four years 10 recipients</p>
<p><u>Māori Education Trust Bachelor of Nursing Scholarship</u> Criteria: Available to Māori undergraduate students who have completed their first year of study. Priority will be given to students enrolled in a Bachelor of Nursing Māori and financial need.</p>	<p>\$1,500 Per annum for two years 12 recipients</p>
<p><u>Māori Education Trust Bachelor of Nursing [North Tec] Scholarship</u> Criteria: Available to Māori students who have completed their first year of the Bachelor of Nursing at North Tec: Tai Tokerau Wānanga. Priority will be given to students with financial need.</p>	<p>\$1,500 Per annum for two years 6 recipients</p>
<p><u>Māori Education Trust New Zealand Certificate In Commercial Road Transport (Heavy Vehicle Operator) (Level 3) Scholarship</u> Criteria: Available to Māori students who are enrolled in the Heavy Vehicle Operator Certificate (Level 3) at North Tec: Tai Tokerau Wānanga. Priority will be given to students with financial need.</p>	<p>\$750 12 recipients</p>
<p><u>Māori Education Trust Conjoint Degree Scholarship</u> Criteria: Available to Māori undergraduate students studying towards a conjoint degree. Priority will be given to students with academic merit and financial need.</p>	<p>\$2,000 12 recipients</p>
<p><u>Māori Education Trust Women In Non-Traditional Trades (Level 4) Scholarship</u> Criteria: Available to Māori women enrolled in a non-traditional pre-apprenticeship trade programme at Level 4 or above. Applicants must be enrolled in a one-year full-time trade programme with a tertiary provider. Priority will be given to applicants with financial need.</p>	<p>\$1,500 6 recipients</p>
<p><u>Māori Education Trust Pre-Apprenticeship (Level 4) Scholarship</u> Criteria: Available to Māori students enrolled in a pre-apprenticeship trade programme at Level 4 or above. Applicants must be enrolled in one-year full-time trade programme with a tertiary provider. Priority will be given to applicants with financial need.</p>	<p>\$ 1,500 14 recipients</p>

<u>Māori Education Trust Pūhoro Scholarship</u> Criteria: Available to Māori undergraduate students who have progressed through the Palmerston North or Auckland Pūhoro Academy programme and are enrolled in their first year of study at a tertiary institute. Applicants must be enrolled in a minimum of a three-year undergraduate degree. Priority will be given to students with financial need.	\$1,500 20 recipients
<u>Māori Education Trust Undergraduate Scholarship</u> The Māori Education Trust Undergraduate Scholarship is available to Māori undergraduate students who are in their second or third year of study in 2019. Priority will be given to students with financial need.	\$1,500 25 recipients
<u>Nicholas Irwin Hunt Writing Scholarship (Undergraduate)</u> Available to full-time Māori undergraduate writers, with preference to those studying in the field of journalism. Priority will be given to students with proven writing ability, academic merit and financial need.	\$3,500 6 recipients
<u>Norman Kirk Memorial Scholarship (Undergraduate) (to be confirmed)</u> Available to full-time Māori undergraduate students studying at a recognised New Zealand tertiary institute. Priority will be given to students with financial need and academic merit.	\$1,000 20 recipients
<u>Regina Rudland Memorial Scholarship</u> This scholarship is available to a full-time Māori student of Ngāti Porou descent, undertaking study in the field of Agriculture or Apiculture at Level 3 or higher. Priority will be given to those with demonstrated financial need.	\$500 1 recipient
<u>Rose Hellaby Bursaries Scholarship (Undergraduate)</u> Available to full-time Māori undergraduate students studying to become qualified or employed in a profession or calling which includes scientific, mathematical or technical skills. Priority will be given to students with academic merit and leadership.	\$1,000 30 recipients
<u>Roy Watling Mitchell Bursaries Scholarship (Undergraduate)</u> Available to first-year full-time Māori undergraduate students who attended secondary school as a Year 13 student in 2019. Priority will be given to students with academic merit and financial need.	\$1,000 24 recipients
<u>Sir Apirana Ngata Memorial Scholarship (Undergraduate)</u> Available to a full-time Māori undergraduate student studying at a recognised New Zealand tertiary institute, who attended Ngata Memorial College as a Year 13 student in 2019. Priority will be given to a student with academic merit.	\$1,000 1 recipient
<u>Sister Annie Henry Scholarship</u> Available to a Māori student who is a direct descendant of Reverend John George Laughton or of Tūhoe descent, to assist with education or training costs.	\$1,000 1 recipient
<u>Ti Maru Māori Trust Scholarship (Undergraduate)</u> Available to full-time Māori undergraduate students enrolled in their final year of study at a recognised New Zealand tertiary institute. Priority will be given to students with academic merit.	\$5,000 3 recipients
<u>HERA – Whanake Scholarship</u> Available to a Māori student in their first year of a four-year Bachelor of Engineering degree (B.E., or B.Eng). The scholarship comprises an annual scholarship and paid summer internship (with HERA) over four (4) years. NOTE: This scholarship closes 4.30pm, Friday, 31 Kohi-tātea (January) 2020.	\$5,000 1 recipient
